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ATHLETICS

GENERAL TERMS

Article 1.

Athletics events will be organized in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF). In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the text in English will be considered as authorized.

Article 2.

The program and duration of the competitions will be fixed by the FISU America Executive Committee in agreement with the Organizing Committee (OC). In principle, the program will last four (4) days and will include the following events:

Article 3.

Each country is authorized to enter in:

- a) For individual events: two (2) athletes both of whom have passed the entry standard for the event in the year before the FISU America Games, or one (1) athlete who has not passed the entry standard
- b) One team event: one (1) team
- c) For the men's and women's 10,000m, a maximum of three (3) athletes, all of whom have achieved the entry standard of the event in the year before the FISU America Games, or two (2) who have not achieved the entry standard
- d) For the half-marathon and race walk for men and women, a maximum of five (5) athletes, all of whom have achieved the entry standard of the event in the year before the FISU America Games, or three (3) who have not achieved the entry standard
- e) Each delegation entering a race walk or half-marathon team shall take part with a minimum of three (3) and maximum of five (5) athletes.
- f) The times of the first 3 (three) finishing athletes of each team shall be aggregated in order to determine the team classification, the team with the lowest aggregate time being the winner, and so on.
- g) A tie shall be resolved in favour of the team whose last scoring athlete finishes nearest to the first place.



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- h) All athletes finishing shall be classified individually and shall be eligible for individual awards.
- i) A team finishing with less than three (3) athletes will not be classified in the team result.

One (1) day prior the First Technical Meeting and before 12:00 noon, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of all competitors at the Technical Information Center (TIC) or at the Main Sport Information Centre.

The final confirmation of entries per event for the first day of competition is one (1) day before the first General Technical Meeting and no later than 12:00 at the TIC.

The final confirmation of entries per event for the remainder of the competition days is at 09:00 hours on the day prior to the first round of the respective event at the TIC.

Any entry not duly confirmed, shall not be taken into consideration except for force majeure.

Article 4.

The minimum qualification standards for track and field events shall be agreed upon by the FISU America Executive Committee.

PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Article 5.

The most recent performance of the participants must be clearly indicated on the individual entry form.

Participating team in athletics must submit photos of their competition uniform on a USB stick before the 1st General Technical Meeting in the



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Technical Information Centre (TIC) or at the Main Sport Information Centre.

Article 6. Deposits

One (1) month before the opening ceremony of the FISU America Games, countries entering in an individual sport must confirm their participation with an advanced payment of 50% of the participation fees per entered athlete and official.

The deposit, which guarantees entry in individual sports, shall be directly collected by the Organizing Committee.

Article 7. Qualification procedure

Track events: The rounds of competition will be arranged in accordance with the IAAF rules (166.1-8) and are determined according to the number of participants after the closing date for entries.

Field events: The qualifying standards for the finals will be determined by the Technical Committee for Athletics.

Twelve (12) athletes, or more than twelve (12), who have all passed the qualifying standard will be allowed to enter into the Final.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Article 8. Nomination

Technical officials will be selected by the OC and FISU America. Food, lodging, and the per diem will be paid by the Organizing Committee.

The Organizing Committee will nominate the number of participating judges.

Article 9. Duration of stay

Unless otherwise stated by FISU America, all international technical officials are to arrive one (1) day prior to their first official meeting as agreed between FISU America and the OC and depart one (1) day after the end of the competition.



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Article 10. Fees

Technical officials have the right to receive remuneration per day in the amount established in the agreement of OC - FISU America for full days of service.

Article 11. Accommodation

Unless FISU America states otherwise, technical officials must be accommodated in double rooms.

BADMINTON

GENERAL TERMS

Article 1.

Badminton competitions will be organized in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of the Badminton World Federation (BWF). In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text will be considered authorized.

Article 2.

The program and the duration of the competitions are set by the FISU America Executive Committee in accordance with the Organizing Committee. The competitions will last four (4) days and will include the following events:

I. Individual tournament:

- Male Event: singles and doubles
- Female Event: singles and doubles
- Mixed: doubles

II. Team tournament:

- Mixed Team Tournament

Article 3.

Each country is authorized to enter a maximum of twelve (12) competitors (six (6) men and six (6) women) as follows:



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I. Individual tournament: men and women

Singles: a maximum of three (3) players in each of the events

Doubles: a maximum of three (3) pairs.

Mixed doubles: a maximum of three (3) pairs.

On the condition that no player plays in more than two (2) events, example: one (1) singles event and one (1) doubles event, or alternatively in two doubles events.

II. Team tournament: Mixed

One (1) team with a minimum of 2 male players and 2 female players and a maximum of 4 male players and 4 female players.

At the first general technical meeting, the head of delegation or its representative will confirm and sign the official list of athletes.

Any entry not duly confirmed at the first General Technical Meeting will not be taken into consideration except by force majeure.

PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Article 4. Deposits

One (1) month before the opening ceremony of the FISU America Games, countries entering an individual sport must confirm their participation with an advance payment of 50% of the participation fees per competitor and registered official.

The deposit, which guarantees entry into individual sports, will be collected directly by the Organizing Committee.

Article 5. Seeding

The seeding will follow the order of the last ranking list published by the BWF, the results in the previous FISU America Games, if applicable.



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Article 6. Draw

The draw will be held during the General Technical Meeting in accordance with the rules of the BWF.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Article 7. Nomination

The technical officials will be selected by the OC and FISU America. The full cost of accommodation, meals and fees will be covered by the Organizing Committee.

The Organizing Committee will nominate the number of participating judges.

Article 8. Length of stay

Unless FISU America establishes otherwise, all international technical officials must arrive one (1) day before their first official meeting as agreed between FISU and the OC and depart one (1) day after the end of the competition.

Article 9. Fees

Technical officials have the right to receive remuneration per day in the amount established in the agreement of OC - FISU America for full days of service.

Article 10. Accommodation

Unless FISU America states otherwise, technical officials must be accommodated in double rooms.

BASKETBALL

GENERAL TERMS

Article 1.

Basketball tournaments will be organized in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of the International Basketball Federation (FIBA). In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text will be



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considered as authorized.

Article 2.

The program and duration of the competitions will be set by the FISU America Executive Committee in accordance with the Organizing Committee. In principle, competitions will last five (5) days and will include:

- one (1) men's tournament: eight (8) teams' maximum
- one (1) women's tournament: eight (8) teams' maximum

The games will be held in covered gyms.

Article 3.

For each tournament, each selected country is authorized to register:

- one (1) team of twelve (12) players

At the first general technical meeting, the head of delegation or his representative will confirm and sign the official list of competitors.

Any entry not duly confirmed at the first General Technical Meeting will not be taken into consideration, except by force majeure.

Article 4.

The OC must provide good quality video recordings of the games on DVD, USB or equivalent media to the participants:

- free for video recordings of their own games
- payment of a fee (as agreed between FISU America and the OC) for video recordings of opponents' games

PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Article 5. Selection

For the selection of joint teams, where the number of entries is greater than the level of authorized participation, the following criteria will apply:



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- a) Entry/nomination and payment of the deposit
- b) The teams that finished in the upper half of the previous FISU America Games competition will be automatically qualified to participate; but they must comply with the conditions of the FISU America registration procedure.
- c) The host country team is automatically qualified

The remaining participating teams will be selected by a wild card system according to the criteria defined by the OC and FISU America (geographic and sub continental representation, FISU America classification, FISU classification, FIBA classification).

FISU America will announce the selection of participating teams no later than three (3) months before the opening ceremony of the FISU America Games.

Article 6. Deposits

Countries participating in basketball tournaments must pay a deposit of 2,500 USD to ensure the participation of their team.

This deposit must be paid to OC no later than March 14, 2022; otherwise, registration will not be taken into account.

Article 7. Draw

For the drawing of the groups, an FISU America classification will be established based on the following criteria:

- a) When participating, the host country is automatically qualified and placed in group A, position 1 (A1)
- b) Previous results of the FISU America Games
- c) Participation in the previous Summer University Games



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d) FIBA classification - higher level and corresponding age group when applicable

Article 8. Deadlines

The selected teams must confirm their arrival and departure to the Organizing Committee and FISU America no later than one (1) month before the start of the tournament. Any country that does not comply with this obligation can be considered withdrawn and a team on the reserve list could be invited for replacement.

The selected teams must arrive at the sports village at least twenty-four (24) hours before their first competition.

Teams arriving late will receive a fine of fifty percent (50%) of the sports team deposit. The fine will be charged to the delegations by the Organizing Committee upon arrival at the Accreditation Center.

Late arrival and breach of the FISU America Regulations will be referred to the FISU America Disciplinary Committee for further action.

Teams that arrive late will not be guaranteed to receive their accreditation on time and may be responsible for the disqualification of the competition.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Article 9. Nomination

The international technical officials are nominated by the NUSFs and must be certified by the FIBA, to be selected by the OC and FISU America. The full cost of accommodation, meals and per diem will be divided among the participating countries; travel expenses will be covered by the applicant countries.

The Organizing Committee will announce the sum of the expenses three (3) months before the FISU America Games Opening Ceremony based on the team's scores.



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The countries participating in the event must provide the Organizing Committee with the names of two (2) referees (1 acting + 1 non-traveling substitute) per team three (3) months before the opening ceremony of the FISU America Games.

The OC and FISU America will designate the NTOs to complement the team of technical officials needed for basketball. The number of NTOs must be agreed between the OC and FISU America.

Article 10. Number of international technical officials

There will be as many FIBA referees as selected teams.

- eight (8) FIBA referees for the women's tournament
- eight (8) FIBA referees for the men's tournament

The OC and FISU America will designate additional NTOs to complement the team of technical officials required for Basketball. The number of referees will be agreed between the OC and FISU America.

Article 11. Length of stay

Unless FISU America establishes otherwise, all international technical officials must arrive one (1) day before their first official meeting as agreed between FISU America and the OC and depart one (1) day after the end of the competition.

Article 12. Fees

The ITOs are entitled to receive remuneration per day in the amount established in the FISU America-FIBA association agreement for all days of service (including travel days).

Article 13. Accommodation

Unless FISU America indicates otherwise, ITOs must be accommodated in double rooms.



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FOOTBALL

GENERAL TERMS

Article 1.

The soccer tournament will be organized in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of the International Football Federation Association (FIFA). In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text will be considered as authorized.

In the Soccer Tournament the participation will be by university and will be the qualifier for the University World Cup Football 2023.

Article 2.

The program and the duration of the competitions will be set by the Executive Committee of FISU America in accordance with the Organizing Committee. In principle, competitions will last eleven (11) days, including a rest day, and include:

- one (1) men's tournament, eight (8) teams maximum
- one (1) women's tournament, eight (8) teams maximum

The number and selection of teams will be set by the FISU America Executive Committee.

Article 3.

For each tournament, each selected university is authorized to register:

- one (1) team of eighteen (18) players

At the first general technical meeting, the head of delegation or his representative will confirm and sign the official list of competitors.

Any registration not duly confirmed at the first General Technical Meeting will not be taken into consideration, except by force majeure.



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Article 4.

The OC must provide good quality video recordings of the games on DVD, USB or equivalent media to the participants:

- free video recordings of own games
- video recordings of opponents for a fee (as agreed between FISU America and the OC)

PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Article 5. Selection

For the selection of joint teams, where the number of entries is greater than the level of authorized participation, the following criteria will apply:

- a) Registration/nomination and guarantee payment
- b) The teams that finished in the upper half of the previous FISU America Games competition will be automatically qualified to participate; but it must comply with the conditions of the FISU America entry procedure
- c) The host country team is automatically qualified

The remaining participating teams will be selected by a wild card system according to the criteria defined by the OC and FISU America (geographic and sub continental representation, FISU America classification, FISU classification, FIFA classification).

FISU America will announce the selection of participating teams no later than three (3) months before the opening ceremony of the FISU America Games.

Article 6. Deposits

Countries that participate in soccer tournaments must pay a deposit of 2,500 USD to guarantee the participation of their team.



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This deposit must be paid to the Organizing Committee no later than March 14, 2022; otherwise, registration will not be confirmed.

Article 7. Draw

For the drawing of the groups, an FISU America classification will be established based on the following criteria:

- a) When participating, the host country is automatically qualified and placed in group A, position 1 (A1)
- b) Previous results of the FISU America Games
- c) Participation in the previous Summer University Games
- d) FIFA classification: higher level and corresponding age group, as appropriate

Article 8. Deadlines

The selected teams must confirm their arrival and departure to the Organizing Committee no later than one (1) month before the start of the tournament. Any country that does not comply with this obligation can be considered withdrawn and a team on the reserve list could be invited as a replacement.

The selected teams must arrive at the sports village at least twenty-four (24) hours before their first competition.

Teams arriving late will receive a fine of fifty percent (50%) of the sports team deposit. The fine will be charged to the delegations by the Organizing Committee upon arrival at the Accreditation Center.

Late arrival and breach of the FISU America Regulations will be referred to the FISU America Disciplinary Committee for further action.

Teams that arrive late are not guaranteed to receive their accreditation on time and may be responsible for the disqualification of the competition.



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TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Article 9. Nomination

International technical officials are nominated by the NUSFs and must be certified by FIFA, to be selected by the OC and FISU America. The cost of full accommodation, meals and per diem will be divided among the participating countries; travel expenses will be covered by the applicant countries.

The Organizing Committee will announce the sum of the expenses three (3) months before the FISU America Games Opening Ceremony based on the team's scores.

The countries participating in the event must provide the names of two (2) referees (1 acting + 1 non-traveling substitute) per team to the Organizing Committee three (3) months before the opening ceremony of the FISU America Games.

The OC and FISU America will designate the NTOs to complement the team of technical officials needed for Soccer. The number of NTOs must be agreed between the OC and FISU America.

Article 10. Number of international technical officials

There will be as many referees as teams:

- eight (8) FIFA referees for the women's tournament
- eight (8) FIFA referees for the men's tournament

Article 11. Length of stay

Unless otherwise stated by FISU America, all international technical officials must arrive one (1) day before their first official meeting as agreed between FISU and the OC and depart one (1) day after the end of the competition.

Article 12. Accommodation

Unless FISU America states otherwise, ITOs must be accommodated in double rooms.



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FUTSAL

GENERAL TERMS

Article 1.

The futsal tournament will be organized in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of the International Football Federation Association (FIFA). In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text will be considered as authorized.

Article 2.

The program and duration of the competitions will be set by the FISU America Executive Committee in accordance with the Organizing Committee. In principle, competitions will last five (5) days, and include:

- one (1) men's tournament - eight (8) teams' maximum
- one (1) women's tournament - eight (8) teams' maximum

The number and selection of teams will be set by the FISU America Executive Committee.

Article 3.

For each tournament, each selected country is authorized to register:

One (1) team consisting of fourteen (14) players (5 active and 9 substitutes).

At the first technical meeting, the head of delegation or its representative will confirm and sign the official list of competitors.

Any registration not duly confirmed at the first technical meeting will not be taken into consideration, except by force majeure.



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Article 4.

The OC must provide good quality video recordings of the games on DVD, USB or equivalent media to the participants:

- free for video recordings of own games
- video recordings of opponents for a fee (as agreed between FISU America and the OC)

PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Article 5. Selection

For the selection of joint teams, where the number of entries is greater than the level of authorized participation, the following criteria will apply:

- a) Registration/nomination and payment of deposit
- b) The teams that finished in the upper half of the previous FISU America Games competition will be automatically qualified to participate; but it must comply with the conditions of the FISU America entry procedure
- c) The host country team is automatically qualified

The remaining participating teams will be selected by a wild card system according to the criteria defined by the OC and FISU America (geographic and sub continental representation, FISU America classification, FISU classification, FIFA classification).

Countries participating in futsal tournaments must pay a deposit of 2,500 USD to guarantee the participation of their team.

This deposit must be paid to the Organizing Committee no later than March



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14, 2022; otherwise, registration will not be confirmed.

Article 7. Draw

For the draw of the groups, an FISU America classification will be established based on the following criteria:

- a) When participating, the host country is automatically qualified and placed in group A, position 1 (A1)
- b) Previous results of the FISU America Games
- c) FIFA classification: higher level and corresponding age group, as appropriate

Article 8. Deadlines

The selected teams must confirm their arrival and departure to the Organizing Committee no later than one (1) month before the start of the tournament. Any country that does not comply with this obligation can be considered withdrawn and a team on the reserve list could be invited for replacement.

The selected teams must arrive at the sports village at least forty-eight (48) hours before their first competition.

Teams arriving late will receive a fine of fifty percent (50%) of the sports team deposit. The fine will be charged to the delegations by the Organizing Committee upon arrival at the Accreditation Center.

Your late arrival and breach of the FISU America Regulations will be referred to the FISU America Disciplinary Committee for further action.

Teams that arrive late will not be guaranteed to receive their accreditation on time and may be responsible for the disqualification of the competition.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Article 9. Nomination

International technical officials are nominated by the NUSFs and must be



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certified by FIFA, to be selected by the OC and FISU America. The cost of full accommodation, meals and per diem will be divided among the participating countries; travel expenses will be covered by the applicant countries.

The Organizing Committee will announce the sum of the expenses three (3) months before the FISU America Games Opening Ceremony based on the team's scores.

The countries participating in the event must provide names of two (2) referees (1 acting + 1 non-traveling substitute) per team to the Organizing Committee three (3) months before the opening ceremony of the FISU America Games.

The OC and FISU America will designate the NTOs to complement the team of technical officials necessary for futsal. The number of NTOs must be agreed between the OC and FISU America.

Article 10. Number of international technical officials

There will be as many referees as teams:

- eight (8) FIFA referees for the women's tournament
- eight (8) FIFA referees for the men's tournament

Article 11. Length of stay

Unless FISU America establishes otherwise, all international technical officials must arrive one (1) day before their first official meeting as agreed between FISU America and the OC and depart one (1) day after the end of the competition.

Article 12. Accommodation

Unless FISU America states otherwise, ITOs must be accommodated in double rooms.

JUDO

GENERAL TERMS

Article 1.

Judo competitions will be organized in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of the International Judo Federation (IJF). In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text will be considered as authorized.

Article 2.

The program and duration of the competitions are set by the FISU America Executive Committee in accordance with the Organizing Committee (OC). In principle, the judo competition will last two (2) days and will include the following events:

I. Individual: each match will be five (5) minutes

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Article 3.

Each country is authorized to enter a maximum of sixteen (16) judokas as follows:

- individual combat (men): a maximum of one (1) judoka per weight category and in the open category
- individual competition (women): a maximum of one (1) judoka per weight category and in the open category
- team competitions (men): a team is made up of a maximum of five (5) judokas and a minimum of three (3) judokas
- team competitions (women): A team is made up of a maximum of five (5) judokas and a minimum of three (3) judokas

Teams must be made up of competitors who also participate in the individual categories. On team competition day, competitors can compete in the weight category in which they are registered or in the next category above.

A competitor who refuses to fight once the victory of the team is assured will be required to retire for the rest of the tournament. He or she will no longer be part of the team. The team may replace the competitor for the next round. If the competitor refuses to compete in the final, he will not receive a medal.

Competitors enrolled in the "open" event can also participate in the weight events category.

Competitors enrolled in the team competition may participate in the weight category corresponding to the person who participated in the singles or the one just mentioned.

At the first general technical meeting, the head of delegation or its representative will confirm and sign the official list of competitors.

Any entry not duly confirmed at the first General Technical Meeting will not be taken into consideration, except by force majeure.



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Article 4.

In judo, there is no possibility of appealing the decision of the referees or judges. All actions and decisions taken in accordance with the rule of "majority of three" by the Referee and the Judges shall be final.

In no case may competitors or their representatives consult the referees or the Referees Commission. Competitors or their representatives cannot appeal decisions and any attempt to approach the Organizing Committee on this issue could result in the exclusion from judo events.

PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Article 5. Deposits

One (1) month before the opening ceremony of the FISU America Games, countries entering an individual sport must confirm their participation with an advance payment of 50% of the participation fees per competitor and registered official.

The deposit, which guarantees entry into individual sports, will be collected directly by the Organizing Committee.

Article 6. Seeding

Those seeded will be designated by Organizing Committee. They will be placed in positions one (1) to four (4). If present, the best athletes of the previous FISU America Games will be seeded according to the rank they obtained. The position of the athletes will be determined by computer. The competition will be executed by simple elimination with double playoff. Once the weight category has been drawn and the results published in the general technical meeting, the order cannot be changed or names of participants added.

Article 7. Draw

The draw will be carried out by computer with the IJF software or other similar software authorized by IJF.



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Article 8. Weighing

The official weighing will take place one (1) day before the start of the competition in accordance with the IJF rules and regulations.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Article 9. Nomination

International technical officials are nominated by the NUSFs and must be certified by the IJF, to be selected by the OC and FISU America. The costs of full accommodation, meals and per diem will be divided among the participating athletes; travel expenses will be covered by the applicant countries.

The Organizing Committee will announce the sum of the expenses one (1) month before the Opening Ceremony of the FISU America Games based on individual entries.

The countries participating in the event must provide the names of two (2) referees (1 acting + 1 non-traveling substitute) per team to the Organizing Committee three (3) months before the opening ceremony of the FISU America Games.

The OC and FISU America will designate the NTOs to complement the team of technical officials necessary for Judo. The number of NTOs must be agreed between the OC and FISU America.

Article 10. Number of international technical officials

- Eight (8) IJF referees

Article 11. Length of stay

Unless FISU America establishes otherwise, all international technical officials must arrive one (1) day before their first official meeting as agreed between FISU America and the OC and depart one (1) day after the end of the competition.



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Article 12. Fees

ITOs are entitled to receive remuneration per day in the amount established in the agreement of OC - FISU America for full days of service.

Article 13. Accommodation

Unless FISU America states otherwise, ITOs must be accommodated in double rooms.

SWIMMING

GENERAL TERMS

Article 1.

Note: If a country cannot present a compound bow team for male or female events, it will be allowed to present a combined gender team to compete in the male compound bow event (one (1) man + two (2) women), or two (2) men + one (1) woman).

- Mixed team events: A maximum of one (1) team in each bow style (one (1) REC mixed team and one (1) COM mixed team)

To shoot in the elimination phase, the archers may be the same as those who make the qualification or any other designated by the delegation. Once both archers are selected, they are not allowed to be replaced.

At the first general technical meeting, the head of delegation or its representative must confirm and sign the official list of competitors accredited by the Internal Control Committee (CIC).

PRE-COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Article 4. Deposits



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One (1) month before the opening ceremony of the FISA America Games, participating countries must confirm their participation with an advance payment of 50% of the total cost of the stay per athlete and registered officer.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Article 5. Nomination

The technical officials will be selected by the OC and FISU America. The cost of full accommodation, meals and per diem will be covered by the Organizing Committee.

The Organizing Committee will nominate the number of participating judges.

Article 6. Length of stay

Unless FISU America establishes otherwise, all technical officials must arrive one (1) day before their first official meeting as agreed between FISU America and the OC and depart one (1) day after the end of the competition.

Article 7. Fees

Technical officials have the right to receive remuneration per day in the amount established in the agreement of OC - FISU America for full days of service.

Article 8. Accommodation

Unless FISU America states otherwise, technical officials must be accommodated double rooms.
